Hello Red Wolf Lodge at Squaw Valley Owners,

Fall temperatures are in the air! The days are warm, but the cold, crisp nights are already upon us. Rumor has it; Mammoth received a dusting of snow at the top of the mountain in mid-September getting everyone's hopes up for a good winter. The current weather models predict there is now "a greater than 90%" chance that El Nino conditions will contribute to a wet 2015/16 winter. This year's strong El Nino is being compared to the 1997 El Nino event that brought a great deal of precipitation and snowfall. Most scientists agree that all evidence suggests the latest El Nino will bring a wet winter, although no one knows for certain if that will translate into a large snowpack.

Exciting Updates

New asphalt and pavers have been installed! The existing asphalt, which was very old with numerous cracks, has been removed and replaced. The area from the first garage entrance at the east end of the building around to the back of the building was re-graded, a new base added and re-paved with two, two inch layers of asphalt. The pavers at the front entrance have been removed and replaced with new interlocking pavers with a slight red color to them. The front entry and around the building looks great!

- Bonus Time rates for the winter season are \$68.40 for a studio, \$74.40 for a one-bedroom and \$92.40 for a two-bedroom.
