The Tahoe region is off to one of the best starts to a winter in a long time. Some might call it epic having already received 245 inches of snow on Upper Mountain. The snow started in early November and just keeps coming. With all the early snow, Squaw Valley and Alpine Meadows opened a week earlier than scheduled. It was one of the earliest openings in Alpine Meadows history. The El Nino weather pattern is producing the precipitation and snow pack that California needs to battle the four year drought. The snow conditions on the mountain have been nothing but incredible. The Mountain is 100% open including the Silverado and Broken Arrow chair lifts, which have not been open in years.

The new blankets are very warm and soft to keep you comfortable on those cold, snowy El Nino winter nights.

Bonus Time 101

As winter quickly arrives, so too will the demand for Bonus Time. To make things easier, we have a few recommendations for you:

- Bonus Time is available to deeded owners in good standing.
- Bonus Time can be booked up to 20 days in advance.
- Availability for Bonus Time is on a first-come/first-served basis and can be booked for only one unit at a time.
- If a unit is not available for the requested date, you may be placed on a waitlist in the order received and our front desk team will contact you as units become available.
- Bonus Time rates for the winter season are \$68.40 for a studio, \$74.40 for a one-bedroom and \$92.40 for a two-bedroom.
